

Beware of fringed water lily

The fringed water lily is a foreign invasive aquatic plant which can cover large areas of the water surface and outcompete native aquatic plants. This in turn causes altered habitats in the water which affects aquatic animals. The fringed water lily changes and reduces the biodiversity in the ecosystem.

Characteristics

The fringed water lily has fringed yellow petals. The leaves are rounded, with wavy edges and up to 10 centimeters in diameter. The lily flowers in July to August.

Please note!

- Do not take boats or canoes through or close to colonies of fringed water lily. The plant spread very easily.
- Do not swim through colonies, due to risk of drowning.
- Do not pick up or move fringed water lily.
